Christina and Donald McLean and their ten children migrated from Argyllshire Scotland to the new colony of Adelaide, South Australia, in August, arriving December 1837. The McLeans initially settled near Adelaide where they grew the first commercial wheat crop in SA. In about 1840 they expanded southwards to the Strathalbyn area. There are now more than 20,000 descendants spread across Australia and elsewhere. The 850 page Big Red Book "published 1995 and about 700 copies were distributed. Ask to view at your state library.
