NEWSLETTER FROM D. & C. McLEAN REUNION COMMITTEE TO ALL REGISTRANTS & DONORS.

The purpose of this newsletter is to bring all registrants to the Reunion and/or donors to our bank account, up to date on what is happening and of some changes to the Saturday program.

At date of posting this newsletter about 150 family members have registered to attend, and applications are still being received up to 7/3/88 when caterers will be advised of exact numbers. The venue is Civic Hall, & Supper Rooms, Brighton Town Hall, Jetty Rd, Brighton (between Town Hall & Brighton Library). I hope that all attending will register as soon as possible after 12 noon - will you advise me if this will be after 5 pm. All registrations to date have been processed and acknowledged in writing, if you haven't received acknowledgement, let me know. The easiest road route to reunion venue is by Anzac Highway, Brighton Road, to traffic lights at junction with Jetty Road, Brighton, turn into Jetty Road, Town Hall is before you reach the railway crossing. If travelling by rain, take train from Adelaide Railway Station to Brighton; Town Hall is about 500 metres owards Adelaide. If travelling per bus, take Bus 23 from King William Street, bus stops in front of Town Hall.

EXTRA SPACE OBTAINED AT TOWN HALL.

We have now been able to obtain (at no extra cost) the use of Brighton Civic Hall, which is separated by entrance foyer from Supper Room & Kitchen. This is a completely integrated and serviced civic complex and will enable the complete gathering to be well looked after.

ALTERATION TO PROGRAM AT STRATHALBYN.

This has been made necessary by reason of the annual "Penny Farthing Bike Rally" (the old bikes with big wheel and small wheel behind) which is being held in High Street, and adjacent streets, in conjunction with a Fair & Variety Stalls, Hirdy Gurdy, Games, etc. It starts from Strathalbyn Post Office at 11 a.m. hence alterations.
