GENERAL:

Over 200 descendants of Donald & Christina McLean registered for our Family Reunion. They were greeted on arrival at the Brighton Town Hall, with family trees of all 10 or is it 12 known children of our pioneers, Donald and Christina, printed on 8 metre x 1 metre cardboard rolls pinned to the walls of the Civic Hall. This was the enterprising work of Mrs Diane Facey, and her sub-committee, at Millicent. Wonderful work, Di! The detail was in the form of computerised strips showing hundreds of lines of descendants known, and this was added to during the Reunion by family members extending the information, or correcting it.

It was added to in interest by many old photographs, press cuttings, etc. It is hoped that there are many more such items "out there" for us to hear about in due course.

Registration staff were kept busy during the afterroon checking registrations, distributing tourist and up-dated Reunion circulars. Also a sale were books of the Archibald Family Line, \$7 each; and souvenir stem wine glasses and beer glasses, \$3 each (more later).

RECEPTION:

At 6.00 p.m. guests were entertained at the President's Reception in the Civic Hall, and at 7.00 p.m. moved into the Supper Room for dinner.

This was catered for by the Committee with a "take-away" type of meal as main course, soup prepared in the kitchen, and home made style fruit pies, etc. And something else!

Jack McLean explained only stumps of old home visible, existing barn nearby is not original and covers the site of Donald's ensilage pit. Thence to the Cemetery in Parker Avenue where many McLean Mary lost 3 children within 2 months in late 1800's from diphtheria! By this time the The gardens on each side of the Childrens Footbridge, giving access day was getting hot! to Soldiers Memorial Gardens was a comfortable venue for lunch, picnic style from the Good Food Shop nearby in individual plastic packs, fruit tea & coffee. After a short rest an inspection commenced of the National Trust Museum in the Old Police Station, near Railway Crossing and of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church. Of particular interest was the Gaelic Bible bought out from Scotland by Donald & Christina, also other items of McLean origin. The Church was not open due the influx of "Bike Rally" visitors, but graceful exterior was viewed from various angles. viewed from various angles. Some of the party also visited the "Bikes" and inspected various parts of the town.

Perhaps if the Book Launch eventuates we can plan a visit to St. Andrew's on the Sunday, to attend divine service there.

UNVEILING OF COMMEMORATIVE OBELISK & PLAQUE: Sunday, 10.30 a.m. saw a crowd of family members assemble in Richmond Road, Marleston, just west of intersection with South Road, to see 102-year old Mrs Eva Congdon, unveil a commemorative obelisk and plaque marking the site of Section 50 allotted to Donald McLean on which he grew the first crop of wheat in S.A. It reads as under:-

CITY OF WEST TORRENS

DONALD McLEAN

GREW FIRST CROP

OF WHEAT IN S.A.

NEAR THIS SPOT IN 1838

Erected by his family, Mar 20th, 1988

The obelisk is in reinforced concrete construction, coloured red with bronze extruded metal plaque affixed to sloping top of 1 metre high obelisk. Mrs Congdon, descended from Allan and a great grand daughter of Donald & Christina, looks wonderful for her years and has a good memory. Another very warm day, very bright for photography.

BACK TO THE TOWN HALL FOR LUNCH:
