Frank Allan Inglis born at Wilson S.A. on 17/3/1880.

Parents : Jane (nee McLean) & Frank Inglis.

Grandparents : Catherine (nee Dawson) & Allan McLean

G-Grandparents : Jane (nee Hamilton) & James Dawson and Christina (nee McPhee) & Donald McLean

He was born at Kanyaka Station near Quorn, SA, he went to Broken Hill in his youth and worked as an engine driver at the Central mine.

MARRIED: Elizabeth Sheridan.

Deaths : Frank and Elizabeth died within a few months of each other in 1944 and are buried at Broken Hill.

They had 5 children.

1. Frank (jnr) Inglis, the eldest, died aged about 16 from walking in the heat from Broken Hill to the Pinnacles (a line of hills about 20 miles from Broken Hill).
2. Ettie Inglis. Married Jack Dial – no children
3. Margaret 'Maggie' Inglis – born 1907. Married Peter Quaine – no children.
4. Laurel Louise Inglis – born 4th February 1910. Married Anton Lantica Zupanovich (born 12/1/1887 at Sandeka Jugoslavia). They had 5 children – Nera, Doris, Anton (Tony), Philip & Frank. They lived in Broken Hill where they both died and were buried.
5. Phillip Terence Inglis – born 5/2/1913 at Broken Hill. Married Noeline Ann Lanthois (born 1941). They had 8 children – Terence, Allan, Brian, Robert, Helen, Peter, Alice & Richard. Residence : Broken Hill.
