Mary Margaret McLean - born 28/10/1885 at the "Rock Lily" Tavern, Mona Vale which was then the staging post for the northern coast.

Grandparents : Christina McLean (nee Black) & Hugh (the elder) McLean G-Grandparents : Christina McLean (nee McPhee) & Donald McLean

Donald built a small wooden house at Narrabeen where there is now the median strip of a 6 lane highway. It eventually became the back scullery and laundry of the 2 storey brick house already mentioned as being both home and Post Office until the new P.O. was erected, (information from Betty O'Gorman, daughter of Kindor McLean).

Married: Albert Brabant c. 1911 and was of Narrabeen.

Death: She died in her 77th year on 22/9/1962.
