He was educated at Strathalbyn then worked for Sir Lancelot Stirling of "The Lodge", Strathalbyn, harnessing horses and driving Lady Stirling in her carriage to church and elsewhere. He subsequently learnt the building trade and was Foreman for Frickers & also worked with Caldwell, the Strathalbyn undertaker.
